

18-Week NHS Wait Target Plan Likely to Fail

Description

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Health leaders are cautioning that the government's efforts to address the hospital backlog in England will fall short without a fundamental overhaul in service delivery.

Labour's proposal to increase weekly appointments and operations by 40,000 to meet the 18-week waiting time target may only address 15% of the required capacity, as per NHS Confederation's research.

A broader transformation in hospital care is urged, advocating for advanced utilization of digital technologies to enhance productivity.

The imminent government review, spearheaded by NHS surgeon Lord Ara Darzi, seeks to identify major impediments in improving waiting times, including concerns about children's health deterioration.

Sir Keir Starmer referenced Lord Darzi's forthcoming review while highlighting challenges in NHS management.

The NHS Confederation emphasizes the need for significant shifts, advocating for investments in digital technologies, robotic surgery, and AI to enhance efficiency and diminish unnecessary procedures.

Streamlining post-treatment evaluations and utilizing remote follow-up checks are among the suggested strategies to optimize resources and reduce patient waiting times.

The report also underscores the importance of improving patient prioritization and data management to avoid misallocation of resources.

The Department of Health and Social Care affirms its commitment to bolstering productivity, merging innovation with increased operational capacity, to revamp healthcare services effectively.
