



Announcement of Divorce by Isla Fisher and Sacha Baron Cohen Draws Attention Following Rebel Wilson's Claims

Description

Actors Sacha Baron Cohen and Isla Fisher have announced their divorce after more than two decades together. The couple, who share three children, released a **statement** saying they decided to split last year. The **statement** highlighted their shared **commitment** to their children and their respect for the family's privacy.

The divorce announcement comes close on the heels of **allegations** by fellow actor Rebel Wilson against Cohen. She accused Cohen of bullying her on the set of their 2016 movie, *Grimsby*. Wilson's memoir includes a **controversial chapter** that details her struggle with Cohen, which he **vehemently** denies.

While timing of Fisher and Cohen's **separation** announcement sparked **speculation** that it was influenced by Wilson's accusations, the source of this connection remains in dispute. Some reports suggest that Fisher was becoming embarrassed and felt compelled to disclose their **separation**, while other sources report that the couple has been living separately since last year.

Despite the split, sources close to the couple confirm their continued **closeness** and shared **affection**, underlining this wasn't a decision taken lightly. Reflecting on their early relationship, Cohen mentioned Fisher's humour and their shared **mockery** of **pretentious** party goers during their first meeting, indicating an immediate connection. The couple became engaged in 2004 and were married in Paris six years later.
