



Back to Black review – woozy Amy Winehouse biopic buoyed by extraordinary lead performance | Back to Black

Description

Renowned for her cinematic exploration of music **legends** and battles with addiction, Sam Taylor-Johnson **captivated** audiences with her 2019 film, "A Million Little Pieces," an **adaptation** of James Frey's debated memoir. Her directorial prowess was first noted in "Nowhere Boy," a poignant narrative on John Lennon's early life.

In her latest venture, Taylor-Johnson delves into the tumultuous life of Amy Winehouse, the iconic soul singer whose voice charmed the world from the streets of London. Winehouse's tragic demise in 2011 due to alcohol poisoning is **heartrendingly chronicled** in this cinematic homage.

Marisa Abela embodies Winehouse, delivering a performance that, while occasionally lacking in the raw **tumult** of Camden's street fights, primarily captures the essence of Winehouse's tormented genius. Jack O'Connell portrays Blake Fielder-Civil, Winehouse's husband, with a **nuance** that lends an unexpected likability to a controversial figure.
