



# Boeing CEO Testifies Before US Lawmakers on Safety Concerns

## Description

Boeing's CEO, Dave Calhoun, is set to testify before US lawmakers, addressing the pressing safety concerns that have **permeated** the company's culture. This testimony follows a mid-air emergency in January, which Calhoun acknowledged as a grave issue, **emphasizing** the company's dedication to **rectifying** these concerns.

The hearing represents a crucial opportunity for stakeholders to hold Boeing accountable and demand **substantial** actions to ensure passenger safety and prevent future tragedies. It is a pivotal moment for Boeing to demonstrate its commitment to safety and rebuild public trust.
