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# California Police Arrest Suspect in Death of Actor Matthew Perry

## Description

Law enforcement officials have announced an arrest in connection with the tragic passing of actor Matthew Perry, as reported by NBC News. The arrest took place in southern California following an investigation by the Los Angeles Police Department into how the beloved Friends star obtained prescription medication. Despite this development, the LAPD has not provided further details at this time.

Perry, known for his candid discussions about his struggles with addiction, was discovered unresponsive in a hot tub at his Los Angeles residence in October 2023. The Los Angeles medical examiner's office determined the cause of death to be the acute effects of ketamine, with contributing factors including drowning, coronary artery disease, and the effects of buprenorphine used to treat opioid use disorder. The autopsy revealed ketamine levels in his system comparable to those administered during general anesthesia, leading to cardiovascular overstimulation and respiratory depression.

Authorities uncovered that Perry had been undergoing ketamine infusion therapy for anxiety and depression, with his final treatment occurring a week and a half prior to his passing. Despite being 19 months sober and having no illicit drugs or paraphernalia present at his home, the mystery surrounding the high levels of ketamine in his blood remains unresolved.

The joint criminal investigation by the LAPD and Drug Enforcement Administration focuses on how Perry obtained the prescription medication and why such a substantial amount was in his system. Perry's history of substance abuse, which began at a young age and intensified during his time on Friends, adds complexity to the circumstances surrounding his untimely demise. However, officials have ruled his death an accident, with no indications of foul play.
