While AI tools like deep research offer efficiency, they lack the nuanced judgement, critical thinking, and expertise inherent in human researchers.

Thus, while AI tools like ChatGPT and deep research present promising advancements, they serve as complementary tools rather than replacements for human intellect. Emphasizing the importance of critical thinking, fact-checking, and deep expertise, human researchers remain essential in navigating the complex realm of knowledge work. As the field of AI continues to evolve, it is crucial for users to engage with these tools responsibly, combining AI efficiency with human intellect to achieve robust and reliable research outcomes.
