



Colton's Fiesta Village Family Fun Park to Close After 50 Years

Description

Fiesta Village Family Fun Park in Colton, California, is set to permanently close after its final operating days on July 10 and 11, ending over 50 years of cherished family experiences including birthday parties and outings. The announcement has elicited strong sentiments from former visitors who regard the park as a significant part of their upbringing.

In a statement shared on social media and their website, the park's owners expressed their gratitude for the generations of families who have made Fiesta Village part of their traditions. Co-owner Michelle O'Brien noted that the decision to close was difficult, reflecting on the park's role as a gathering place for families and friends.
