

Crypto firm sues SEC, requests court to declare Ethereum token as nonsecurity

Description

A legal battle between the crypto industry and the Securities and Exchange Commission escalated as Consensys, a major supporter of the Ethereum blockchain, sued the agency in Texas federal court. The lawsuit aims to stop a potential SEC lawsuit against Consensys over its MetaMask wallet and clarify that Ether, Ethereum's digital token, is not a security.

Consensys argues that the SEC's attempt to regulate Ethereum is illegal and threatens blockchain technology. This comes as SEC Chairman Gary Gensler cracks down on crypto companies, including Coinbase and Uniswap.

The SEC's focus on Ethereum staking has sparked controversy. Consensys founder Joe Lubin called the notion of staking turning Ethereum into a security "preposterous." The lawsuit seeks to prevent the SEC from investigating Ethereum as a security.

The lawsuit sets the stage for potential appeals in higher courts, including the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit and the Supreme Court. The outcome of the SEC's response remains uncertain.
