

Dawn Richard Files Lawsuit Against Diddy for Sexual Misconduct

Description

Music industry mogul Sean "Diddy" Combs is currently embroiled in yet another legal battle, this time with former Bad Boy Records signee Dawn Richard. The Danity Kane singer has filed a lawsuit against Combs, accusing him of sexual assault, inhumane treatment, and witnessing him physically abuse his ex, Cassie Ventura.

She is seeking compensatory damages, mental anguish compensation, punitive damages, and coverage of legal fees.

Combs' attorney, Erica Wolff, has denied the allegations, stating that Richard's claims are fabricated for financial gain. Combs stands by the truth and is prepared to defend himself in court.

This lawsuit adds to a string of legal troubles for Combs, including settling a rape and abuse lawsuit with Ventura, as well as publicized incidents of physical violence captured on video.
