



Health Officials Recommend Erie Cracker Barrel Patrons to Monitor Themselves for Hepatitis A signs

Description

The esteemed media outlets of [WJET/WFXP](#) have recently reported on a decidedly unsettling incident: the confirmation of a Hepatitis A case within the jurisdiction of Erie County. The locality's Department of Health has swiftly assured that, should there be individuals who are alarmed by the possibility of exposure, there exist suitable resources and measures available to address the situation.

Following this development, Cracker Barrel, the establishment implicated in the health scare, has promulgated a statement emphasizing their assertive response to this situation. They have enlisted the support from entities at both the corporate level and the Department of Health. The joint effort aims to guarantee an environment that radiates security and well-being for all.

The individual diagnosed with Hepatitis A, it transpires, held an employment position at Cracker Barrel, specifically at 7810 Interstate Drive. As Breanna Adams, the Director of Environmental Health Services for the Erie County Department of Health, elucidates, "Given the excessive contagion of Hepatitis A via food products and other goods, it is imperative, and indeed, protocol, to reveal this information to patrons who may have consumed meals on-site or received their orders through takeaway or delivery services from the affected location."

Hepatitis A, a perilously communicable liver ailment, manifests in an array of symptoms, including lethargy, diminished appetite, and nausea among other less noticeable signs. Bearing this in mind, health professionals assigned to this case urge the public to maintain vigilance for these manifestations as symptoms can emerge anywhere from two to seven weeks post exposure.

Erin Mrenak, the Erie County Department of Health's Director emphasizes, "Any individuals who have frequented the restaurant between January 30 and February 21, 2024, inclusive of those availing delivery or takeout services, ought to be observant for any manifestation of Hepatitis A symptoms. Furthermore, those dining in or availing takeout from the 10th through 21st of February 2024 should make haste in acquiring their vaccinations following potential exposure."

Cracker Barrel Media Relations have released a statement to reassure the public and its staff members that the incident is anomalistic, entirely confined to their location in Erie, Pennsylvania. Furthermore, they conscientiously attest their commitment to customer safety, expressing unequivocally that no other stores have been adversely affected.



The statement derived from Cracker Barrel Media Relations reads as follows:

"In light of the isolated circumstance in which an employee at our Erie store has been diagnosed with Hepatitis A, we have taken immediate, proactive steps. Our course of action includes temporarily terminating our operations this evening for an intensive cleaning and sanitizing procedure. Following completion, our doors will reopen at 7 a.m. tomorrow. Concurrently, we are liaising closely with the Erie County Health Department and scheduling vaccinations for our employees."

The statement further emphasizes, *"We want to lay to rest any concern or speculation, assuring our esteemed customers and valued staff that our location in Erie has undergone rigorous safety and health measures, akin to all our stores in Pennsylvania, which have fortunately remained untouched by this incident. We anticipate welcoming back our patrons to our Erie location tomorrow morning."*

Breanna Adams further announced, "In the case of individuals who have dined at the location and harbor queries or concerns, we have allocated resources to a call center that will operate over the course of the weekend, with limited hours extending from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. today and 12 p.m. to 6 p.m. on both Saturday and Sunday."

Adams reassured that the Erie County Department of Health is synergizing with the State Department of Health to procure additional vaccines and organize vaccination events in the upcoming week.
