



Liam Payne's 'Pink Cocaine' Controversy: What You Need to Know

Description

On Monday, the initial toxicology report regarding Liam Payne, the One Direction star, was made public, revealing the presence of one or more drugs in his system. An official informed the Associated Press that the preliminary findings indicated "evidence of exposure to cocaine." However, it was emphasized that these initial results do not accurately represent the concentration of substances circulating in his blood at the time of his tragic passing.

Just last week, a preliminary autopsy disclosed that Payne, who was 31 years old, succumbed to "polytrauma" along with "an internal and external hemorrhage" following a fall from the third-floor balcony of his hotel in Buenos Aires. Investigators discovered narcotics and alcohol throughout Payne's hotel room, alongside scattered and broken furniture, as per the Associated Press report.

In parallel coverage, sources relayed to ABC News that the toxicology analysis indicated multiple substances found in Payne's system, notably including pink cocaine—a complex concoction consisting of various components such as ketamine, MDMA, opioids, and methamphetamine. Dr. Chris Tuell, the clinical director of addiction services at Ohio's Lindner Center of HOPE, explained that pink cocaine—also known as Tusi or Tuci—does not typically contain any actual cocaine. It is primarily a powdered mix comprising psychoactive substances, including hallucinogens, anti-anxiety medications, stimulants, and depressants.

Mell McCracken, the executive director of No Matter What Recovery in Los Angeles, noted that the vibrant color of pink cocaine, due to food dye, has gained traction due to its "psychedelic and stimulant properties." Users often report effects similar to those of ecstasy (MDMA), such as heightened feelings of wellbeing and sociability. However, McCracken cautioned that this drug can lead to severe consequences, including anxiety, paranoia, and life-threatening conditions if consumed in substantial quantities. Other potential side effects encompass nausea, muscle spasms, and enduring mental health issues.
