## Misunderstood: The Truth Behind This Woman's Pig Comparison

### Description

Megyn Kelly has called on Disney to dismiss Rachel Zegler, spotlighting her as the “pig” leading the studio's imminent live-action film, *Snow White*, after Zegler hurled an expletive at President-elect Donald Trump.

On her SiriusXM show, the conservative commentator launched [a scathing critique](#) of the 23-year-old actress.

Kelly stated, “Imagine if a Broadway actress said, ‘F Biden supporters, may Biden and Kamala never know peace.’ Such a person would be fired in an instant.”

“Hey, Disney! You may need to recast, because this woman is a pig. You dismissed Gina Carano for much less than this,” Kelly insisted. “She needs to go, like, yesterday. There’s something off about this person.”

Kelly’s comments echoed the 2021 firing of actress Gina Carano from *The Mandalorian* after her controversial remarks equating the treatment of conservatives to the Holocaust.

Meanwhile, Zegler, who is currently performing in *Romeo + Juliet* and won a Golden Globe for her role in *West Side Story*, expressed her anguish over Trump’s recent electoral success, claiming it heightened societal hatred. She remarked on Instagram, “Another four years of division in a world where I fear for my daughter’s future.”

In a subsequent Instagram Story, she reportedly added, “f--- Donald Trump.” However, Zegler later issued an apology, acknowledging that her emotions had taken over.

Kelly extended her critique on her show, suggesting audiences should avoid attending Zegler's Broadway performance while questioning Disney's choices in casting such a polarizing figure.
