In another dramatic duel, 15-year-old Maisie Whittall faced off against Italian Matilde Modesti. The tension could not shake Maisie's confidence as she clinched victory in the playoff round, much to the delight of her father, the designated caddy for the week.

Whether it was the tranquil paradise of Marbella or the palpable undercurrent of rivalry and camaraderie, the competition stood as a testament to talent and sportsmanship. The participants hold their experiences as stepping stones to future golfing careers, keeping the spirit of the sport alive even in the next generation.
