## Real ER Doctor Discusses Common Plotline in Pitt's Season 2

### Description

In the popular medical drama "The Pitt," one of the most significant plotlines in its second season reflects a common issue in real hospitals. According to ER doctor J Mack Slaughter, the shutdown of electronic medical records is not uncommon and can elicit strong reactions from healthcare professionals watching the show.

Slaughter suggested that a solution is needed to reduce the frequency or eliminate these outages, calling it "a really big problem." He expressed hope that in the future, such issues will seem outdated.

For now, there seems to be no immediate resolution in sight, but the hope remains that season three of "The Pitt" may depict a reduction in these disruptions.
