



Rebel Wilson book published in the UK with Sacha Baron Cohen text redacted

Description

Australian actress Rebel Wilson's autobiography has been published in the UK with some parts removed. The important section that was taken out has caused controversy. The book was also published in the US and it caused a fuss when Wilson accused another actor, Sacha Baron Cohen.

When the book was published in the UK, there was an area that was blacked out. Many believe this part was about Baron Cohen. A message was included explaining that the part was removed because of UK law.
