



Sam Altman's World Targets Human Verification Expansion with Tinder

Description

Sam Altman's verification project, World, has announced major plans for expansion at an event near San Francisco. The company aims to integrate its verification technology into dating apps like Tinder, ticketing systems for events, businesses, and other public services. This is important because it will help ensure that online users are real people and not bots.

World, previously known as Worldcoin, is unique because it can verify a living person's identity while keeping their information private. The technology is based on a method called "zero-knowledge proof," which allows for such confirmation without revealing personal data.

The company uses a device called the Orb, which scans a user's eyes. This scan creates a unique identifier known as a verified World ID. Users can access World's services with this ID, although the app is still usable without it.

Recently, World has worked with Tinder, which previously ran a successful pilot program in Japan using World ID. This partnership will help Tinder confirm that their users are real people globally.

In addition to dating apps, World is launching a feature called Concert Kit, allowing artists to reserve concert tickets for verified fans. The aim is to protect fans from ticket-buying bots. The company also plans to introduce other identity verification features to combat online security threats.
