What's UVA and UVB?

Most UV radiation that comes from the sun is UVA and UVB. UVB is what causes sunburn, cataracts, and skin cancer.

UVA goes deeper into your skin and can lead to skin cancer.

Does glass protect you from UV?

All glass in windows stops UVB, but only laminated glass can fully stop UVA. UVA can pass through other types of glass and damage your skin, increasing the risk of cancer.

Car windshields block UVA, but the side and rear windows don't. Tinted windows can help protect you from UVA.

Should you wear sunscreen in the car?

If you have tinted windows, you might not need sunscreen in the car. But without tinted windows, your skin can get damaged.

Using sunscreen and sunglasses

If the UV index is high, wear sunglasses while driving or sitting by a sunny window to protect your eyes. When you need sunscreen depends on your skin type, where you are, and the time of year.

It's important to protect yourself from UV radiation to avoid skin damage and cancer.
