



Trump's Campaign Targets Offshore Wind with Financial Incentives

Description

The Trump administration has agreed to pay \$1 billion to the French energy company TotalEnergies to stop its offshore wind projects in the U.S. This decision affects planned developments off the coasts of North Carolina and New York. Officials say the funds will support a liquefied natural gas terminal in Texas and other fossil fuel projects. They describe the agreement as "innovative," claiming it ends financial support for an unreliable offshore wind industry.

This shift follows federal court decisions that blocked President Trump's attempts to halt offshore wind development through executive orders. Senator Chuck Schumer, a Democrat from New York, criticised the payout, calling it a misuse of taxpayer money. In contrast, Robin Shaffer, leader of an anti-offshore wind group, supported the move, arguing that offshore wind leases were harmful to the marine environment.

Trump has consistently opposed offshore wind, claiming wind turbines are costly and harmful to wildlife. Recently, he reiterated his commitment to ending the offshore wind industry if he returns to office. The U.S. is currently facing rising energy prices, and Democrats argue that stopping offshore wind projects is a poor decision during this energy crisis.

As investigations into the legality of this payment continue, many within the government question the direction of U.S. energy policy.
