

Wyoming Reports First Human Bird Flu Case; Total Reaches 70 Across 13 States

Description

The avian influenza, commonly known as bird flu, is currently sweeping across the United States, leading to a scarcity of eggs and escalating prices at both grocery stores and dining establishments. Despite this widespread concern, the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u> assures the public that the current health risk remains low.

Just recently, the <u>Wyoming Department of Health</u> confirmed its inaugural human case of the H5N1 strain. This latest development marks the third hospital admission owing to the virus in the country.

Meanwhile, Ohio reported another case, disclosed to <u>CBS News</u>, involving a farmer who had contracted the virus, subsequently requiring hospitalization. Fortunately, this individual has been discharged, becoming the fourth such case nationwide.

According to the <u>CDC's website</u>, there are now 70 confirmed human cases of bird flu spanning 13 states, including a fatality in Louisiana linked to the H5N1 virus. The tally escalated as Wyoming and Ohio reported new cases.

The wave of avian influenza has been wreaking havoc on animal populations as well, with poultry, wild birds, dairy cows, and even domestic cats falling prey. As stated by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, nearly 23 million birds were impacted in January alone, and since February 2022, over 138 million birds have succumbed to H5N1.

In conclusion, although the bird flu continues to spread like wildfire, the CDC maintains that the general public's health risk is minimal. The affected states include Washington, Oregon, California, Nevada, Colorado, Texas, Louisiana, Iowa, Missouri, Wisconsin, Michigan, Ohio, and Wyoming.
